

INTRODUCTION



Admission Procedure

Eligibility for Admission in B.Ed. Course :-

Jharkhand B.Ed. Admission is based on a state-level entrance examination conducted by the J.C.E.C.E.B. Ranchi.

To apply for Jharkhand B.Ed. course candidates must apply online through the official websites.


- Candidates must visit the official website <http://jceceb.jharkhand.gov.in/>
- They must apply online for the Jharkhand B.Ed. Exam and fill in the necessary details required for the form. After filling out the application form, candidates must pay the application fee and submit the application form.
- Candidates must have successfully completed their undergraduate or postgraduate degree.
- They must score a minimum of 50 - 55% marks in their undergraduate and/or postgraduate degree.
- There is no age restriction to apply for Jharkhand B.Ed. Admission.

Eligibility for Admission in D.El.Ed. Course :-

- Candidates having passed Sr. Secondary or equivalent Examination with Arts/ Science/ Commerce from a recognized board / university with at least 50% marks.
- The relaxation and reservation for SC/ST/ OBC/ PWD and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government / State Government as applicable.
- **Age Limit** :- Minimum 18 years as on 1st July of Admission year.

Selection Procedure for Admission :-

- ❖ *On the date of counselling all original documents must be produced.*
- ❖ *Merit list will be displayed on the college notice board.*



ACADEMICS

The College follows the syllabus prescribed by Kolhan University. In addition to what is prescribed by university, the college offers various value added courses /seminars/workshops. The teacher trainees remain under the guidance of mentor who guides the students in academics /self-study course as well as in personal life. Besides the marks obtained in terminal exams, different assignments, projects, group discussions, guest talks, brainstorming sessions and their involvement in co-curricular activities are evaluated for internal assessment. Communicative English classes for students are conducted on a regular basis which helps them in their placements. Computer classes and language lab helps them for better understanding.

INTERNSHIP

The schools are selected for internship/practice teaching as per the norms of the universities. The teacher trainees are expected to participate and organise morning assemblies, games, sports, and other co-curricular activities apart from taking regular classes. Marks are allotted based on their performance during internship.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Following the motto of D.B.M.S. ज्योतिर्मय - ज्योतिर्देही (Jyotirmay - Jyotirdehee), the college is committed in carving out generation who would take an active role in social activities. The college has various Clubs namely: Eco Club, Literary Club, Rotaract Club etc. which organises different activities throughout the year like blood donation camp, essay competition, painting competition etc. Inter college events are also organised annually.

LIBRARY

Vast collection of Course Curriculum Books, Journals, Encyclopaedia, dictionaries, magazines and newspapers in both Hindi and English are available in the library. Comfortable reading and writing tables for students use are provided.

The library of DBMS College has 5000+ books on Education which are used extensively by the students and teachers. The books are issued digitally by the librarian. Besides textbooks it also has journals, encyclopaedias, subject dictionaries, and variety of other books donated by our well-wishers.

GAMES AND SPORTS



Rules & Regulations

- I. Students shall strictly comply with the rules and regulations of the college issued from time to time relating to their studies, examination, conduct and discipline.
- II. No refund of fees will be made on withdrawal of admission under any circumstances.
- III. Intake of any sort of intoxicating substance is strictly prohibited. Chewing of Paan / Gutka / Chewing-gum etc is also prohibited.
- IV. Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the classroom.
- V. All trainees are supposed to attend the classes in proper uniform. Dress code decided by the management of the college is compulsory for every student.
- VI. Wearing the college identity card is compulsory in the college campus.
- VII. Minimum attendance for students shall be 80% of all course work including practicum and 90% for school internship. The college expects the students to attend all the classes regularly.
- VIII. The student's name is liable to be dropped from the rolls if, he/she is absent continuously for more than 10 days without prior leave note. Re-admission fee will be charged if at all re-admission is granted.
- IX. Original college leaving certificate once deposited at the time of admission will not be returned to the trainee. Therefore, the students are advised to keep xerox copies of their original CLC or any other document for their use during the stipulated academic year.
- X. Provisional certificate may be issued on payment of Rs.500.
- XI. After passing the university examination, College Leaving Certificate will be issued on payment of Rs. 500. In case of loss

or damage, duplicate CLC may be issued on request with an affidavit by notary public on payment of Rs. 500.

- XII. The institution reserves the right to cancel the admission of any student and ask him/her to discontinue his/her studies at any stage of his/her career on grounds of unsatisfactory academic performance, irregular attendance, or indiscipline.
- XIII. All the trainees must attend college function and activities such as cultural functions, seminars, symposia, debates, quizzes, essay competition, sports, picnic community services, exposure programmes etc.
- XIV. Prior permission is required from the principal for any absence either from theory or practical classes and community life activities. Application should be submitted for leave.
- XV. The college has a well-maintained library of books and periodicals. Every student is expected to make the best use of it.
- XVI. The trainees are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in maintaining the premises neat and tidy.



Cells & Committees

(1) **Placement Cell** : D.B.M.S. College of Education has a dynamic and a dedicated placement cell committed to empower students to develop capabilities and competencies that will help them shape their careers and stand apart from the crowd.

The placement cell conducts regular workshops on resume writing, effective communication, how to face interviews, personality development sessions, mock interviews etc. so, that our students are well prepared to face the interviews

successfully. Most of our students are placed in the best schools of Jharkhand.

(2) Women's Cell : D.B.M.S. College of Education has a Women's Cell to empower girl students and women faculty members. Its objectives are to ensure a safe campus for women, enhance their understanding of their rights, address practical issues, and provide equal opportunities.

(3) Alumni Association (SETU) : The Alumni Association originally formed in 2020 was restructured and renamed SETU (Strengthening Educational Ties Uniting Alumni) in 2025 to better reflect its mission of building strong, lasting connections among graduates, faculty and current students. SETU serves as a vibrant platform for fostering professional growth, collaboration and mentorship within the educational community. Its main objectives include promoting continuous learning through workshops and seminars, creating networking opportunities for alumni, supporting institutional development, and guiding students through career counselling and training initiatives. The outcomes of SETU's initiatives have been significant-enhanced alumni engagement, increased placement support for students, and a stronger sense of belonging among members, ultimately contributing to the overall growth and reputation of D.B.M.S. College of Education.

(4) Student Welfare Committee : D.B.M.S. College of Education started with this Committee keeping the following points in mind.

(6) Teacher Welfare Committee : D.B.M.S. College of Education ensures favourable working for all the teaching staff members. Coordinate for benevolent facilities for the members of staff. Plan for general welfare activities for teaching and administrative staff. Build a healthy working environment and foster good relationship among teachers.

(7) Admission Cell : D.B.M.S. College of Education started with admission committee to assist the management in getting admission and to prepare list of admitted students and check original documents and keep personal file of the students with proper certificates.

(8) Examination Cell : D.B.M.S. College of Education formed this Committee, which is authorised to conduct examination, moderation, prepare examination schedule & declare the results.

(9) Maintenance and Campus Development Committee : D.B.M.S. College of Education has a eco-friendly campus and maintains it regularly. It supervises all the purchase made in the campus.

(10) **Sports Cell**: D.B.M.S. College of Education believes health is wealth. So the sports committee is to promote every individual's health, physical wellbeing as well as the acquisition of physical skills among the students. This committee aspires to inculcate qualities such as sportsmanship, team spirit and bonding.

(11) **Grievance Cell**: The Grievance Redressal Cell aims to look into the complaints lodged by any student and redress it as per requirement. The students can state their grievance regarding any academic and non-academic matter within the campus through the grievance/ suggestion box. The institution aims at solving the grievances of the students within a stipulated time. The Grievance Redressal Cell has been developed with the aim for further strengthening the bond of the students with the institution by providing them with all kinds of facilities for maintaining a convenient ambience of academic teaching and learning.

The students may lodge grievance about any academic and non-academic matters related to -

- ✓ Timely issue of Mark-sheets, Transfer Certificates, Conduct Certificates or other examination and scholarship related matters.
- ✓ Dues and payments for various items from the library, other financial matters.
- ✓ Certain misgivings about conditions of sanitation, quality of food in the canteen, availability of transport, victimization by teachers and any other offensive activity.

(12) Anti-Ragging Cell : Our college adhere to “UGC Regulation on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009”.

The Cell acts as the supervisory and advisory committee in preserving a culture of ragging free environment in the college campus. The main objectives of this cell are as follows:

1. To make the students aware of Anti-Ragging at the time of admission
2. To create awareness among the students about the dehumanizing effect of ragging.
3. To keep a continuous watch and vigil over ragging to prevent its occurrence and recurrence.
4. To promptly and stringently deal with the incidents of ragging brought to the Committee's notice.
5. To generate an atmosphere of discipline by sending a clear message that no act of ragging shall be tolerated and any act of ragging shall not go unnoticed and unpunished.

(13) NSS : The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit 1 of D.B.M.S. College of Education was established in April 2025 with the aim of fostering a spirit of voluntary service, ethics, and accountability among the youth. 


